是次畫展除了可以展示自己喜愛的作品,又能與人分享繪畫心得,還可以 得到同學、老師和眾親友親臨指導,令我十分感動。

升旗禮分享



2018年七月我參加了南京大學領袖培訓計劃。 是次交流,我不僅大開眼界,更深刻體會我們這一代 青年人對於自身、甚至社會應負起的責任。

我印象最深刻的是參觀南京大屠殺遇難同胞紀念館。紀念館分五個部分。第一個部分是最黑暗,也是最震撼的,展示了日軍侵華的種種暴行,當年有近30萬同胞不幸遇難,接近三分一的南京城被日軍縱火燒毀。一進館,只有小部分倖存者的照片掛在牆上,一個一個燈箱的熄滅,代表著倖存者一個一個地離開世界,亦象徵著曾經親身見證過這段歷史的人越來越少,我雖然在中史課讀過這段歷史,但限於文字層面的理解,好像隔了一層膜。參觀這個紀念館卻彷

佛走進歷史現場,更深刻體會當年南京市民在水深火熱中的掙扎及無助。展館的最後一個部分,是最光明的,代表戰爭結束,各國迎來了和平。整個紀念館的鋪排別具深意,寓意人類從黑暗步向光明。有兩句話在館里出現,我一直牢牢記著:「前事不忘,後事之師」、「記住歷史,但不要記住仇恨」。我作為旁觀者尚且對泯滅人性的暴行難以釋懷,更何況被暴行蹂躪的倖存者。我們要記住歷史的教訓,以免重蹈覆轍,以任何理由殘殺生命都是不被允許的。不要記住仇恨,仇恨只會滋長更多仇恨,亦無助解決問題。

與南京大學生的交流啟發我思考現今年青人的社會責任。交流團有一個關於「中國夢」活動,這是由十二個社會主義核心價值觀組成的執政理念。起初,我以為南京大學的學生會發表一些無條件擁護、支持「中國夢」的意見,事實並非如此。他們比我想像中更理性、更全面地分析社會的情況。建立美好的社會是年青人追求的理想。「路漫漫其修遠兮,吾將上下

化、制度等因素,身為年青人更應負起責任,為建設 美好社會作出貢獻。他們有理想,有主見,不偏頗, 願意承擔的特質,給我留下深刻的印象。

除此之外,他們勤奮向學的態度亦令我敬佩。其中一個學生為了考進大學,勤勉苦讀,從家鄉小鎮一步步考進大城市的大學。她這種堅毅不屈的的學習態度很值得我們學習。聽著她侃侃而談建設美好社會的理想與挑戰,表現自信,不禁令我反思香港學生求學的態度。這些交流生對於家事、國事、天下事,皆事事關心。生活在同一土地,我們的生命彼此連結,沒人能獨善其身。星星之火,可以燎原。只要每個人都願意承擔責任,便可建構一個美好的社會。別輕看學生微弱的力量,別只顧埋首測驗考試,別給自己太多藉口漠視周遭的人和事。做好學問,關心社會、國家、時事,盡己綿力,為社會作貢獻。希望大家能修己善群,他日成為社會棟樑。

懲教署更生先鋒「思囚之路」

鐵窗生涯會留下生命中無法洗刷的烙印,可惜不少青年到步入鐵窗才明白這切膚之痛。為此,懲教署「更生先鋒計劃」推出「思囚之路」,讓學生以第一身步入「鐵窗」,體驗審訊判刑、收押囚禁及步操等監獄生活,並接觸在囚人士,反思生命。2018年6月12日,本校共30多名學生前往馬坑監獄,參與「思囚之路」活動。以下是同學活動後的分享:



蘇詠茵 6C

我了解到法庭的聆訊及判刑過程,更體驗了在囚人士的生活。每天準時起床,把自己的物品收拾得井井有條,等待懲教署的職員來檢查他們的行為舉止需要循規蹈矩, 從而反思過錯。

蘇珮雯 6C

我認識到香港在囚人士的生活環境、法庭聆訊的過程和明白到奉公守法的意義。

一位在囚人士闡述自己因為貪快錢而運毒,才了解後果嚴重。我體會到一時貪念, 會令人後悔莫及,所以我們要好好遵守法律。

「坐牢」,我一直覺得離我很遠,然而經歷了這一次活動,我明白 到原來它離我們很近一假如我們輕視法律及法律後果,便可能跌入深不 見底的法網之中。故此,我明白了奉公守法的重要道理。

活動中警官叫我們睡在牢房的床上,思考一下如果自己一時貪念犯法,最擔心自己的人會是誰?我想起了我的父母。我實在不希望他們失望和傷心。這次經歷,提醒我面對貪念的時候要拒絕,不要讓愛惜自己的人失望。



中文科語文活動 一 解憂雜貨店」

一個人的力量很渺小、很卑微,但有一根無形的繩子將人類連結在一起,形成一股龐大的力量。一個微小的行動,就如蝴蝶效應般,擴大再擴大,一個微小的舉動,會影響人的一生。在《解憂雜貨店》中,最深刻是那叛逆少年最後的咆哮與悲慟,似是嘲笑,似是諷刺,又帶著濃濃的悲哀。他一次意氣之舉,換來的卻是一個陌生人無形的鼓勵,讓他重回正途。正如戲中浪矢爺爺説過「寫信來的,心中早已有了答案,只是想有人給予他正面的回應,讓自己明白沒有錯。」

我的理想並不宏大,只希望將來有能力照顧家人。我就 是這樣朝著目標進發。其實,志向大小並不重要,最重要 是它能激勵我們努力向前。各位同學,你為自己設定了目 標嗎?



立定志向 奮發向上

本學年9月及10月的分題「立定志向 奮發向上」,目的是鼓勵同學為自己定立目標。不少文章 強調,目標定位要夠 "SMART" 才容易達成。

S=SPECIFIC是指要有明確、具體的目標。很多同學訂目標時都不夠具體,例如:「我想今年努力一點」的目標較為含糊。

M=MEASURABLE的意思是可量化。例如有同學說「希望今年成績進步」。「進步」是指考試平均分還是測驗分數?進步百分之五還是平均分進步3分?沒有可量化的目標,很難知道自己能否達到目標。

A=ACHIEVABLE的意思是可達目標。目標定得 太高或太長遠都不利執行,假如目標定得太高,根 本就無法達成,到時可能連立志的動力都消失殆 盡。

盧維中老師

R=REALISTIC即是要現實。例如同學的目標是要入大學。但這目標對一位初中生來說是比較遙遠的。這些長遠目標通常要一些短期目標的配合才能化成具體的行動。

T=TIME RELATED目標須設期限。對學生來 説,以一個月或一星期作為計劃目標比一學期來得 較容易。

下面以5D班的曾向昇同學為例,分享一下他在 新學年有甚麼目標及如何計劃突破自己。

曾向昇同學的SMART目標

- A) 一學期中期目標: 學期名次上的突破(全級名) 次進步30名)
- B) 一星期的短期目標:
 - 每天用1-2小時學習:預習課本, 溫習當 天老師教過的知識;



盧維中老師和5D班曾向昇同學

- 溫習時把手機放在遠離自己視線的地方, 避免受自己受電子產品的影響而分心;
- 3)每星期用2-3小時接觸英文書或聆聽英文新 聞報導,同時以生字簿記錄新詞彙,強迫 自己用英文和其他同學或老師溝通。

最後,送給同學們兩個詞:「堅持」和「希 望」。「堅持」鼓勵同學做事不能虎頭蛇尾,輕言 放棄。「希望」則讓我們帶著樂觀積極的心態去實 現目標。

克服困難

界愈來愈精彩,除學習畫畫,還嘗試多種運動:如短 跑、游泳、長跑等。

另一個分享個案。余翠怡11歲時生骨癌,接受化療之後傷口發炎,要切除左腳小腿並裝上義肢。她16歲加入香港傷殘人士體育協會,剛加入時,她以練習游泳為主,後來轉練輪椅劍擊運動,多年來獲獎無數。

她們的成功,並不是看見自己的不足,他們是看見自己擁有的,並加以發揮。在場的每一位同學都是肌體 健全,但大家有沒有好好發揮自己的潛能呢?

每個人身上都有各自的弱項,如語文、數學、運動、 集中力等等,但是不是每個人都會有決心,為理想、為 目標,跨越這些障礙呢?如果你能跨越困難,我相信你 的將來一定有可能比我剛才所分享的人士更精彩、更成 功。

香港也有一位「僕人領袖」。他就是深水埗的明哥。深水 埗是全港最窮的地區之一,很多基層家庭和露宿者居住在這 裏。明哥是飯店店主,每日派飯盒給露宿者和其他有需要的 人,不僅如此,他還會與取飯者閒聊,關心他們的需要。去年 颱風「天鴿」襲港,明哥風雨不改送出200多盒飯給有需要的 人。他的義舉感動了不少人。他們紛紛跟隨明哥一起派飯,給 有需要的人,認定明哥是他們的領袖。這也是「僕人領袖」的 風範。

只要我們有一顆謙卑服侍人的愛心,就可以成為「僕人領 袖」。

升輔大使分享

律師是指受當事人委託或法院指定依法協助當事人進行訴訟和出庭辯護的專業人員。律師需要具備專業的法律知識去實現社會的正義。

香港法律是沿用英格蘭的普通法系,所以律師就分為 大律師和事務律師兩類。事務律師出庭的發言權是受到限 制的,不可以代表當事人在高等法院的審訊中盤問證人。 事務律師的工作主要是處理繁複的法律文件,例如準備樓 宇買賣協議或遺書等。而大律師在所有的法院中如高等法 院和終審法院都可以有發言權利,就是我們在電影或劇集 中常見的形象。 香港三所大學均有提供四年全日制的法律課程,分別是 香港大學、香港中文大學和香港城市大學。課程內容包括 基礎法律知識和司法事務等等。完成了大學學位課程後, 還需要修讀法學專業證書課程,再加上實習才可以正式當 律師。大律師需要實習兩年,而事務律師只需實習一年。

人人都知道律師需要具備細密的分析能力和良好的表達 能力。其實,法律課程亦對語文能力的要求極高,因此入 學門檻亦比其他學位課程要求嚴格。例如同學在DSE英文 科要考獲5等以上和中文科要考獲4等以上,才有資格報讀 法律系。
